The illustrations attached are all from Yantra Yoga Manual by Chögyal Namkhai Norbu (Shang Shung Edizioni 2006).

They have been mirror-imaged to face the same direction as the illustrations in The Eye of Revelation. They illustrate 'phrul 'khor nyi zla kha sbyor which entered Tibet (from India) in the Eighth century. The last movement (the one that looks like rite 5) is used in a number of 'phul 'khor systems. They are not identical by any means, but are similar. If you want better quality scans let me know.
